The Otay River Estuary Restoration Project is Under Way!

In September, construction will begin on the Otay River Estuary Restoration Project, which includes the restoration of nearly 125 acres of coastal wetlands and salt marsh habitat in the southern portion of San Diego Bay. In preparation for this work, crews will temporarily relocate the Saturn Boulevard Bike Path approximately 30 feet south of its existing location. This will allow crews to safely haul excavated soil from the Otay River Floodplain to Pond 15.

Thank you for your patience during construction.

What to Expect During Construction

- » Construction work Monday through Saturday between the hours of 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. Work outside these hours will be noticed in advance. Holiday work is not anticipated.
- » To accommodate bird nesting season, the majority of work that will use city streets will be performed between October 1 and February 15 over the next three years.
- » Hauling of material via trucks along Bay Boulevard in the City of Chula Vista and the City of San Diego.
- » Intermittent traffic delays. Please allow extra travel time during construction hours. The project's earthwork is anticipated to be completed in early 2025 with additional restoration work including planting and paving to follow.
- » On-site construction project manager available as needed.

The Otay River Estuary Restoration Project is a partnership between Poseidon and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service to restore and enhance 125 acres of coastal wetlands to benefit native fish, wildlife, and plant species, and provide habitat for migratory shorebirds and other salt marsh-dependent species within the South San Diego Bay. The project is aligned with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service's long-term goal of restoring wetland habitat and helps fulfill Poseidon's commitment to mitigating environmental impacts from the Carlsbad Desalination Project.
